If you are after quality pewter decanters from Etain and Prestige be in quick. This French company was founded in 1669 but sadly several months ago stopped production. I managed to acquire a limited stock but they won't last. I've found a new French supplier, but stock won't be here until mid year.



Still on history - Laguiole knives - Founded in 1859, Andre Verdier is one of France's oldest cutlery manufacturers; based just outside Paris. Blades are made from professional quality X46Cr13 stainless steel and handles are fixed using 5 stainless rivets. Each piece features the trademark Laguiole Bee and is completely hand crafted in France. For your information "Laguiole" designates a "type" of knife and the area of production, not a brand or trade name.

There is much mythology about the insect depicted on the catch. Some say it represents a fly or a horse-fly, something familiar to peasants in the rural Laguiole area, which is known for cattle breeding. Others say the insect is a bee. One story states the bee was the imperial symbol used by Napoleon and was allowed to be used by local manufacturers in recognition of the courage of local soldiers (I like the sound of this story). In store we have a range of Laguiole products at a range of prices. Because of their quality and reasonable price points, they are a standard line in store.

Keep an eye out for new season scarves (something different about these.....) I'll keep you posted.
